Duane was a 1959 graduate of Bethlehem Vocational High School. He retired from Ingersoll-Rand/Ingersoll-Dresser Pumps, Phillipsburg, NJ with 36 years of service. Duane served 20 years in the U.S. Navy Reserves. While on active duty, he was stationed at Johnsville Naval Air Research and Development Activities Center in Warminster, PA, where he met the *Project Mercury* astronauts during their training in what was the largest human centrifuge in the U.S. at that time. He was very proud of and felt very lucky to be part of the development of the early space program.

A calling hour was held on Tuesday, March 4th at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church (206 East Main St., Bath, PA 18014), followed by funeral services and interment at Forks Cemetery, Sullivan Trail, Easton, PA.

## Featured Members

**This month's featured AACC member is**  
Rob Bloch of Allentown, PA  
**('25 Corvette Hysteria Purple Metallic E Ray)**

I placed my E-Ray deposit on 5/31/2023 with *MacMulkin Corvette* in Nashua, NH. After a long wait, my car was produced in Bowling Green, KY on 1/17/2025 and shipped to *MacMulkin* a few weeks later. From there, it was transported on 2/24/2025 directly to *Immaculate Paint Protection* in Allentown, which is owned by Bill Fetter. Bill thoroughly cleaned and polished it, applied ceramic coating and paint protection film. When he was

finished, I picked it up with my father Bob. While there we ran into Bob Beckowski (AACC newsletter editor) who took some great photos and suggested doing a writeup for the 'Vetter's Letter.

My E-Ray is a 2025 hard-top convertible in hysteria purple metallic paint with sterling silver dual racing stripes. It has the 2LZ package, GT2 seats in two-tone black & sky cool gray, front end hydraulic lift, interior stealth trim package, carbon fiber ground effects and rear spoiler, clear rear spoiler bridge w/Jake logo, bright polished forged aluminum wheels, bright red painted brake calipers, and scrape armor front grill guards.

As of this writing, I have only put about 120 miles on it

(full break-in is 500 miles and rpms are limited until then). Off the line, the acceleration already feels much quicker than my 2020 Stingray. The feel of the front-end is different due to the AWD. I can't wait to "let her rip" once I achieve the 500 mile break in. I think the Corvette designers and engineers did a phenomenal job with this American Supercar!

### Corvette E-Ray description from Chevy

*With an electrically powered front axle, E-Ray is a first-of-its-kind Corvette. Designed for all-season performance, this supercar and its eAWD capability is prepared to take on the conditions – rain, snow and everything in between.*

*The E-Ray is the first all-wheel drive Corvette. It is a hybrid (not a plug in), and the quickest accelerating Corvette made to date (0 to 60 rated at 2.5 seconds, which is the same as the upcoming ZR1). The rear wheels are powered by an internal combustion gas engine which is a 6.2-liter naturally aspirated V-8 producing 495 horsepower (same engine as the Stingray).*

*The front wheels are powered by a 160-horsepower permanent-magnet synchronous electric motor. It recharges its 1.1-kWh battery primarily through regenerative braking. Stealth Mode allows you to only use the front electric motor for 3-4 miles if you choose (when you hit 45 mph the combustion engine will automatically start).*

*Combined total horsepower is 655 with 592-foot pounds of torque. Top speed is 183 mph, and the 1/4-Mile is 10.6 sec @ 128 mph. The transmission is an eight-speed dual clutch that shifts in 100 - 300 milliseconds.*

*Tires are Michelin Pilot Sport 275/30R20 fronts & 345/25R21 rears. Brakes are Performance Brembo carbon ceramic.*

Spring has sprung and there is so much going on in our club this year! Several big trips are planned along with *Springfest*, *Fiberglass & Steel*, cruises, and so much more.

I decided a few days ago to get my Corvette out after winter storage, pull the battery tender, and check her out. VRooooom... after a few cranks she jumps to life and demands a run down the road to loosen up a bit. The Vette did not disappoint--such a great feeling. No matter what year or model Corvette you drive, the feel of the wheels on the road is great, isn't it? As I rounded the bend into home ground and up the driveway, I noticed an oil spot on the garage floor where she had wintered and realized a service call was needed.

Enter Dan Reph, owner and chief tech at *Reph's Complete Auto Care*. Not only is he the shop owner/operator, he is also a fellow "Vette Head" with a C8, so he knows his way around a Corvette and is very careful as well. That's sure important. Not only did he find and repair my minor leak issue, but he addressed several other issues that I didn't even know about. These would have been catastrophic on a road trip. In addition, he is the only tech I've ever met who provided a step-by-step video for me to view of all that was done to my car. ## "Who Knew" - The Pony Express

### 1,966 miles in 10 days!

Young men once rode horses to carry mail from Missouri to California in the unprecedented time of only 10 days! This relay system crossing eight states was the most direct and practical means of east-west communications in 1860. From Missouri to California the *Pony Express* riders could deliver a letter faster than ever before.

The completion of a coast-to-coast railroad was years away. At that time, the railroads extended only as far west as the Missis-

issippi River. The completion of a telegraph linking both coasts was close to becoming a reality, but it would still be more than a year before it could be completed.

The *Pony Express* was in operation for only 18 months between April 1860 and October 1861. Nevertheless, the *Pony Express* has become synonymous with the Old West. In the era before easy mass communication, the *Pony Express* was the thread that tied East to West.

## Corvette Racing at QATAR: Another Corvette GT3 Win!

**LUSAIL, Qatar (March 1, 2025)** – TF Sport delivered the first FIA World Endurance Championship victory for the Chevrolet Corvette Z06 GT3.R as Daniel Juncadella, Jonny Edgar and Ben Keating won the *Qatar 1812Km* on Friday to open the season.

The trio drove the No. 33 Corvette Z06 GT3.R to a remarkable victory as they came from 13th in class at the start to win by less than a half-second. It's the second win in as many 2025 races

for the Corvette GT3 racecar as it also won the GTD class of the *Rolex 24 At Daytona* in the hands of customer team AWA. The victory was the first in the FIA WEC and in a Corvette for both Juncadella and Edgar, and it was the eighth in the championship for Keating – including four in a Corvette. TF Sport won its eighth race in FIA WEC competition and for the first time since the 2022 *Six Hours of Fuji*.

The three drivers and the No. 33 TF Sport team worked their magic in the race's opening half. Keating drove from 13th at the start to sixth in a little more than three hours in his first WEC race since winning the 2023 GTE Am title in a Corvette. Keating completed his required driving time and handed off to Edgar for his first laps in FIA WEC competition. The progression up the order continued through a double-stint as the race went into darkness and the Corvette up into third place.

Juncadella drove a double-stint of his own and moved the Corvette into the class lead for the first

time just past the halfway point. Another stellar run by Edgar kept the No. 33 Z06 GT3.R in the thick of it heading into a climatic final hour.

Juncadella got back in the Corvette with a little under 90 minutes to go and made his last pit stop for fuel and left-side tires to counter a full-service stop with four fresh tires for the second-place No. 59 McLaren. The two cars ran nose-to-tail for the final 30 minutes as Juncadella withstood the immense pressure holding off his pursuer and navigating the faster traffic.

Things didn't work out as well for the No. 81 entry. Tom Van Rompuy began the race ninth in class and steadily moved toward the front and inside the top-five in his opening stint. Disaster struck with a mechanical issue shortly after Van Rompuy's first pit stop in the form of a broken alternator pulley shaft that forced the retirement of the No. 81 less than an hour into the race.

**TF Sport and the rest of the FIA WEC field moves on to its next race at the Imola Circuit in Italy on Sunday, April 20.**

THE USUAL COMMENT I HEAR FROM "OLD TIMERS"....THE HOT ROD, MUSCLE CAR SET OF THE FIFTIES AND SIXTIES.....AS THEY WALK AROUND THE SHOWROOM IS.... "THAT IROC-Z CAMARO MAY LOOK GOOD, BUT IT DOESN'T COMPARE TO THE GOOD OLD DAYS....THOSE '69 Z CARS WERE REAL CARS....PURE UNADULTERATED POWER!" MOST LIKELY A LOT OF YOU READING THIS ARE THINKING THE SAME THING, THE NEW CARS JUST DON'T COMPARE. WELL,....HAVE I GOT NEWS FOR YOU! COMPARING QUARTER-MILE PERFORMANCES OF THE 1960'S QUICKEST VERSUS THE QUICKEST OF TODAY IS LIKE COMPARING APPLES TO ORANGES. BOTH ARE FRUIT, BUT ARE TOTALLY DIFFERENT. CHEVY'S OF THE '60'S REALLY DIDN'T HAVE THE GOOD TRANSMISSION RATIOS COMPARED TO TODAY FOR "LAUNCH" OFF THE LINE. THEY ALSO DIDN'T HAVE 25% OF THE TRACTION THAT TODAY'S TIRES HAVE. TODAY'S TIRES ARE AT LEAST A FULL SECOND QUICKER CAR-FOR-CAR, POSSIBLY MORE.

LET'S DO SOME COMPARISONS OF OLD VERSUS NEW. IF YOU TAKE A NEW CAMARO Z-28 WITH A STOCK 305 - 4 BBL. AND A T-5 FIVE SPEED MANUAL TRANSMISSION, IT SHOULD RUN A STANDING QUARTER-MILE IN ABOUT 16.0 SEC. AT 83 MPH. COMPARE IT WITH AN OLD '55 CHEVY. WHEN NEW, IT WAS A 265 CID V-8 WITH 4 BBL. AND DUAL EXHAUST - PUTTING OUT 180 HORSEPOWER THRU A THREE-SPEED MANUAL TRANSMISSION TO A 3.55 OPEN REAR END (NO POSI TILL '57). THE '55 IN STOCK FORM RAN 16.0 SECONDS AT 85 MPH. SO DID MOST 300 HP./ 327 CID CHEVYS IN THE '60'S. NOT TOO MANY WENT QUICKER THAN 15.50 SECONDS STOCK. TODAY'S '85 CORVETTE WITH MANUAL TRANS. IS QUICK! IT WILL RUN A QUARTER-MILE IN 14.30 SEC. AT ALMOST 98 MPH. AN AVERAGE
