Dave and Susan Hornung of Allentown, PA are the proud owners of this beautiful 1967 Ermine White roadster with a teal convertible top and white and bright blue interior. This color combination is very rare, with approx. 10 in existence. The car also includes the optional removable hard top. Dave and Susan purchased this car about 16 years ago and it has won 1st place in its class at the Tri-County NCCC East Stroudsburg show for the past 12 years in a row. This '67 also has won 4 Top Flight awards from NCRS with scores ranging from 96.3 to 98.9.



The car has the original 327 c.i. V8 engine producing 350 horsepower through a 4-speed manual transmission. Besides the removable hard top, the other options on the car include power steering, power windows, AM/FM push-button radio, posi-traction rear axle and red line tires. It had a body-off restoration in 2000 which was done by Tony Stanz of "Back in Time".

Dave and Susan's first Corvette was a '65 Marina Blue Convertible with a white/bright blue interior. Dave says, "There is nothing like the raw power of a midyear Corvette, the feel of the engine, shifting of the gears and the body style of the Sting Ray."

The tenth highest bid was for the first production (2013) **Corvette 427 Convertible** (\$600,000). Besides getting to spec out his new ride, the winning bidder (Ron Pratte) received Jeff Gordon's driver uniform and other racing goodies all while still writing off a donation for the AARP Drive for Hunger charity.
